# NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

# History

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is Central Government sponsored programme falls under the jurisdiction of Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. Jawaharlal Nehru as first Prime Minister of post-independent India played a very important role in introducing NSS in academic institutions. NSS was launched in Mahatma Gandhi's Birth Centenary Year 1969, in 37 Universities involving 40,000 students. Mahatma Gandhi always insisted the idea that students and youth should be involved in the nation building process and service to the nation. He suggested that instead of undertaking academic research about economic and social disability, the students should do "something positive so that the life of the villagers might be raised to a higher material and moral level". Gandhiji insisted that the first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the service of those who provided the sinews of the nation with the national goods & services so essential to society. Therefore, fostering social responsibility, inculcating dedication, commitment to solving social problems and developing personality through community service are the main aims of NSS. Today NSS has grown as one of the biggest social service institution and youth movement in the world with more than 33 lakhs of dedicated volunteers all over the country.

# **Objectives**

The broad objectives of NSS are to:

- 1. Understand the community in which they work
- 2. Understand themselves in relation to their community;
- 3. Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem Solving process;
- 4. Develop among them a sense of social and civic responsibility;
- 5. Utilize their knowledge in finding practical solution to individual and community Problems;
- 6. Develop competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities;
- 7. Gain skills in mobilizing community participation;
- 8. Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude;
- 9. Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and
- 10. Practice national integration and social harmony.

## The Motto

The motto or watchword of the National Service Scheme is: "NOT ME BUT YOU". This reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless service and appreciation of the other person's point of view and also to show consideration for fellow human beings. It underlines that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society on the whole. Therefore, it should be the aim of the NSS to demonstrate this motto in its day-to-day programme.

# **NSS Symbol**

The symbol of National Service Scheme is based on the "Rath" wheel of Konark Sun Temple stated in Odisha. These giant wheels of the Sun Temple portray the cycle of creation, preservation and release, and signify the movement in life across time and space. The design of symbol, a simplified form of the Sun-chariot wheel primarily depicts movement. The wheel signifies the progressive cycle of life. It stands for the continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social transformation and upliftment.

# **NSS Badge**

The NSS symbol is embossed on the NSS badge. The NSS volunteers wear it while undertaking any programme of community service. The Konark wheel in the symbol has eight bars which represent the 24 hours of the day. Hence, the badge reminds the wearer to be in readiness for service of the nation round the clock i.e. for 24 hours. The red colour in the badge indicates that the NSS volunteers are full of blood i.e. lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is a tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the humankind.

# **NSS Day**

NSS was formally launched on 24th September, 1969, the birth centenary year of Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation. Therefore, 24th September is celebrated every year as NSS Day with appropriate programmes and activities.

# NSS Song

During Silver Jubilee Year 1994 the NSS theme song has been composed. All NSS volunteers are expected to learn the theme song, which is given to them and sing the song during NSS programmes and celebrations.

# **University Level Advisory Committee**

The NSS Advisory Committee at University Level will be an apex body as far as implementation of NSS at University Level is concerned. The Programme Coordinator will approach the University Advisory Committee for approval of NSS budget, covering NSS activities and establishment expenditure on NSS cell and also programme activities to be undertaken during the year.

# **Programme Coordinator**

The Programme Coordinator is the key functionary as far as NSS is concerned. Therefore, a Dedicated and devoted Programme Coordinator can plan, execute and evaluate the NSS activities in a proper perspective. The Programme Coordinator, who is a senior teaching faculty, will execute all administrative and policy directives of the government, decisions of the State Advisory Committee and University Advisory Committee. The NSS programme will be prepared in the light of the guidelines issued by the Government of India.

# **Programme Officer**

The Programme Officer, who is a member of the teaching faculty, provides necessary leadership to the youth/NSS students. The teacher/NSS programme officer has the professional knowledge and skills. He/she is expected to be a role model of the values and the norms of the institution and the society as a whole. He/she is expected to provide necessary guidance to the students in developing their personality through community service. In fact the Programme Officer is a friend, philosopher and guide to the students in achieving this goal.

## **NSS Volunteer**

The NSS volunteer, student enrolled in the university is the main beneficiary of the programme by way of development of his/her perception about the community, his/her skill to perform certain jobs, and develop quality of a leader, organiser, and an administrator and development of his/her personality as a whole. Through NSS, he/she gets opportunities to see the community closely and thus gets an experience of human nature in relation to his/her environment. This is how the NSS programme aims to make NSS student youth better citizens through "Development of their personality through Community Service".

# **Community**

The community provides NSS volunteer the first-hand knowledge of living conditions of masses to the NSS volunteers and thus, the process of mutual learning starts. The interaction of community with students and teachers while on one hand enrich the personality of student volunteers and on the other hand help the community to improve its living conditions.





Date- 14th June 2023 to 21st June 2023 Mode- Online




Lastly, a poster was uploaded as an invitation to the webinar, encouraging all volunteers to join the event to commemorate International Yoga Day.

#### **Mode- Online**



Dr Smruti Ranjan Das enlightened the inner spirit of all the NSS volunteers to build a better future for tomorrow.














#### **KSFH NSS Special camp**


#### DAY - 4 (23/12/2023)

## A REPORT ON DENTAL SCREENING AND TREATMENT CAMP AT HMV DRIVER TRAINING INSTITUTE (GOVT OF ODISHA – ASHOK LEYLAND), CHHATIA

The NSS Unit of Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, KIIT Deemed to be University & Department of Public Health Dentistry of Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, Bhubaneswar has collaborated with the HMV Driver Training Institute, Chhatia. Following the philosophy of the "Art of Giving" initiated by our Founder, Prof. Dr. Achyuta Samanta, under his leadership a free dental screening and treatment camp was organized on **15.2.2024**, as per the regular dental checkup camps to be conducted at the driver training institute.

Basic dental treatments like scaling and restorations were carried out among 186 screened patients in the mobile dental van and some of them were referred to the tertiary institute for further complex treatment procedures. 2 patients were diagnosed with Oral Submucous Fibrosis (OSMF) and 1 patient was diagnosed with Erythroplakia because of paan, gutkha and khaini chewing habit. They were referred to KIDS for tobacco cessation counselling and other necessary treatment.

The treatment done included - Oral prophylaxis-76, Tooth Restorations-30













### A REPORT ON DENTAL SCREENING AND TREATMENT CAMP AT HM DRIVER TRAINING INSTITUTE (GOVT OF ODISHA – ASHOK LEYLAND), CHHATIA

The NSS Unit of Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, KIIT Deemed to be University has collaborated with the HMV Driver Training Institute, Chhatia. Following the philosophy of the "Art of Giving" initiated by our Founder, Prof. Dr. Achyuta Samanta, under his leadership, a free dental screening and treatment camp was organized on 1.02.2024, as per the regular dental checkup camps to be conducted at the driver training institute the camp was organized.

Basic dental treatments like scaling and restorations were carried out among 98 screened patients in the mobile dental van and some of them were referred to the tertiary institute for further complex treatment procedures.

Patients diagnosed with Oral Submucous Fibrosis (OSMF) and Tobacco Pouch Keratosis were referred to KIDS for tobacco cessation counselling and other necessary treatment.

The treatment done included - Oral prophylaxis-45, Restorations-56







## A REPORT ON DENTAL SCREENING AND TREATMENT CAMP AT 3<sup>rd</sup> BATTALION NDRF, MUNDALI, CUTTACK

The Disaster Management Act has statutory provisions for constitution of National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) for the purpose of specialized response to natural and man-made disasters.

Accordingly, in 2006 NDRF was constituted with 8 Battalions. At present, NDRF has a strength of 16 Battalions with each Battalion consisting of 1149 personnel. In the beginning, the personnel of NDRF were deployed for routine law and order duties also. In a meeting of the NDMA with the Prime Minister on October 25, 2007, the need of NDRF being made a dedicated force was highlighted and accepted. This led to the notification of NDRF Rules on February 14th, 2008, making NDRF a dedicated force for disaster response related duties, under the unified command of DG NDRF.

Since its inception NDRF has continued to win hearts of millions of countrymen, by demonstrating its expertise and compassion while handling disaster situations. The list of such challenges is long. The officers face stressful situations and work, day and night for the public. Due to their busy schedules, they could contribute less time to oral hygiene. So as Public Health Dentists we must target and assess the oral health status and advice necessary treatment needs to this community to create awareness regarding maintaining good oral hygiene and oral health care habits which can be beneficial for maintaining their overall health as oral health is the gateway to general health.

The NSS Unit & Department of Public Health Dentistry of Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, Bhubaneswar has collaborated with the 3 rd. battalion NDRF, Mundali, Cuttack. Following the philosophy of the "Art of Giving" initiated by our Founder, Prof. Dr. Achyuta Samanta, under his leadership, free dental screening and treatment camps are permitted to be organized monthly at the 3rd battalion NDRF, Mundali, Cuttack. All the patients attending the camp will be provided consultation, treatment procedures like teeth cleaning, tooth extractions and tooth fillings all free of cost. If the treatment cannot be performed at the camp site, those requiring advance treatment are referred to the college. These weekly dental checkup camps to be conducted shall be beneficial for the staff and families of the organization.

On 29th January 2024, a dental camp was organized at 3rd battalion NDRF.

A total of 190 staff and families of 3 RD battalion NDRF were screened and rendered basic dental treatment like scaling and restorations and were referred for other complex treatments like root canal treatment and prosthetic rehabilitation to the tertiary institute.

The treatment done included -Oral prophylaxis-96, Restorations- 74.

An educative oral health talk was given by our doctor volunteers, Dr. Kunal Jha (Prof.), Dr. Gunjan Kumar (Prof.) to all the staff and families of the 3 RD battalion NDRF regarding the need for maintaining good oral hygiene and stressing on tooth decay, gum diseases, tobacco cessation and measures of prevention. This will be followed up by routine dental visits conducted fortnightly hence forth.







## A REPORT ON DENTAL SCREENING CAMP AT S.S HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL OF EDUCATION AND TECHNOLOGY, DHENKANAL

Following the philosophy of the "Art of Giving" initiated by our Founder, Prof. Dr. Achyuta Samanta, under his leadership, a Mega Health Check-up camp was organised by the NSS Unit of Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, Bhubaneswar at Swamy Sridhar Higher Secondary School of Education and Technology, Sadangi, Dhenkanal on **21.01.2024**. in association with the Kalinga Institute of Medical sciences.

the free dental screening and treatment camp was conducted by Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences on 21.01.2024.

235 patients received free dental consultations. They were referred to the tertiary institute for further complex treatment procedures.

The screened patients mostly were diagnosed with chronic generalised periodontitis, grossly decayed teeth, tooth wear (generalised attrition and abrasion) and stain and calculus deposits. Few of them were diagnosed with **Tobacco Pouch Keratosis**. Few paediatric patients were diagnosed with **early childhood caries**.

The patients with **Premalignant lesions** like **Oral Submucous Fibrosis** were referred to the tertiary institute for tobacco counselling.

The camp provided free delivery of medications, which benefited the patients. The patients were instructed on how to safeguard their gums and teeth against gum diseases, tooth decay, quitting of smoking, keeping good oral hygiene, and using correct dental hygiene practices.

262 patients received free dental consultations. Few patients received dental treatments like scaling and restorations in the mobile dental van and some of them were referred to the tertiary institute for further complex treatment procedures.

The screened patients mostly were diagnosed with chronic generalised gingivitis, grossly decayed teeth, tooth wear (generalised attrition and abrasion) and stain and calculus deposits.

The treatment done included - Oral prophylaxis-117, Restoration-73.

The patients with **Premalignant lesions** were referred to the tertiary institute for tobacco counselling.

The camp provided free delivery of medications, which benefited the patients. The patients were instructed on how to safeguard their gums and teeth against gum diseases, tooth decay, quitting of smoking, keeping good oral hygiene, and using correct dental hygiene practices.











## DENTAL TREATMENT CAMP AT ODISHA ASSOCIATION FOR THE BLIND, MOTHER TERESA ROAD, SATYANAGAR, BHUBANESWAR

Under the leadership of our Founder, Prof. Dr. Achyuta Samanta, following his philosophy the "Art of Giving", A free dental check-up and treatment camp was organized at Odisha Association for the Blind, Mother Teresa Road, Satyanagar, Bhubaneswar.

On **6.01.2024** the NSS unit of Kalinga Institute of Dental Sciences, Bhubaneswar conducted the free camp.

Effective dental care is essential for overall well-being. People's quality of life is impacted by poor oral health and untreated dental diseases, especially those who are visually impaired. Due to poor oral hygiene practices, patients with visual impairments are more vulnerable to periodontal and dental caries. Poor dental health is caused by their diet, eating habits, medications, physical inactivity restrictions, and inadequate cleaning practices.

Since the visually impaired individuals depend much on sound, speech and touch, to orient themselves to situations, an Oral health educative talk was delivered to them and tooth brushing technique was taught using the dental care model by audio-tactile method for proper oral hygiene maintenance. Using the **Braille System**, they were made to read the instructions on how to maintain good oral hygiene.

Free consultations and free dental check-up were carried out among 63 individuals including staff and students.

Treatment done- 43 oral prophylaxis

For all other complex treatment procedures and prosthetic rehabilitation, patients were referred to our institute.

#### **Enhancing Oral Health for Children with Special Health Care Needs**

Children with special health care needs (CSHCN) face unique challenges related to their oral health. These challenges can arise from physical, developmental, or behavioural conditions that require specialized attention and care. As part of our commitment of NSS unit of KIDS to inclusive health care, various social services and initiatives have been developed to address the oral health needs of CSHCN.

#### **Determinants Affecting Dental Services for CSHCN:**

- 1. **Needs Assessment**: Understanding the specific oral health needs of CSHCN is crucial. Conducting thorough assessments helps tailor interventions and policy recommendations.
- 2. **Policy Advice**: Evidence-informed policymaking is essential. By assessing needs, policymakers can provide targeted advice to improve oral health services.
- 3. **Oral Health Interventions**: Implementing appropriate interventions, such as preventive measures, dental treatments, and education, directly impacts CSHCN's oral health.
- 4. **Providers' Perception**: Healthcare providers play a vital role. Their understanding of CSHCN's unique requirements influences service delivery.
- 5. Access Barriers: Identifying and addressing barriers (financial, geographical, or attitudinal) ensures equitable access to oral health services.

#### **Recommendations from our NSS unit of KIDS:**

- 1. **Needs Assessment**: Regular assessments of CSHCN's oral health status should be conducted. Involving parents/carers in this process provides valuable insights.
- 2. **Policy Interventions**: Policymakers should develop evidence-based interventions. These may include awareness campaigns, community health literacy programs, and support for seeking appropriate services.
- 3. **Reducing Disparities**: Efforts to minimize barriers to accessing oral and dental health services are crucial. Collaboration between healthcare providers, educators, and policymakers can help achieve this goal.

Conclusion: By prioritizing oral health for CSHCN, we are contributing to their overall well-being. Let us continue working together to create a more inclusive and supportive environment for all children, regardless of their health challenges.

# **COMPOSTING**

The NSS school of electrical engineering, under the guidance of NSS PO, Prof. Snehalika, organised an engaging and hands-on workshop focused on composting, promoting sustainable practices among the participants. 

March 14, 2024


