




1. Introduction

Access to University Track Economically Disadvantaged Groups Applications

The KIIT Deemed to be University as a body measures/tracks applications & admissions of underrepresented (and potentially underrepresented) groups including ethnic minorities, low-income students, non-traditional students, women, LGBT students, disabled students, and newly settled refugee/displaced students etc.

In 2024, the university's student and staff community reflected strong diversity, inclusivity, and global representation:

- 1. 58% of students were female, with 7% enrolled in non-traditional disciplines such as engineering and technology. (Gender Representation)
- 2. 3% of students belonged to Scheduled Tribes (ST) and other indigenous communities, while 4% came from non-English speaking backgrounds, including international students. (Social and Cultural Diversity)
- 3. 63% of the student body were the first in their families to pursue higher education. (<u>First-Generation Learners</u>)
- 4. 29% of students came from low socio-economic backgrounds, benefiting from scholarships and financial aid. (Socio-Economic Diversity)

1.4 Community-Based Educational Programs for Poverty Alleviation

The University is continually involved in educational outreach activities beyond the campus through its faculty members, staff and its students. They provide voluntary and free educational programs to School students in remote and rural areas belonging to different standards.

❖ Programmed Basis-Intellectual Inputs to Adopted Schools

The University has also adopted 17 number of primary schools in rural areas where our students provide regular intellectual inputs and our university provides organizational, infrastructural and financial supports. Access to University academic and sports facilities is provided to these schools.

Within the academic framework of present syllabus approved by Govt of Odisha, the University helps the school in the following domains:

The KIIT University enormously contribute to the educational ventures of its sister concern, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), institute specially for rural, tribal students in terms of providing the Man Resources: Students / Faculties / Staffs and all types of Financial & Infrastructure resources to conduct various types of educational events for community development.













Educating Tribal Students

KIIT University's staff and students actively support the initiatives of its sister institution, KISS, which is dedicated to eradicating poverty through education. KISS Bhubaneswar is a fully free, residential institution providing education from kindergarten to post-graduation for 30,000 underprivileged tribal children, along with accommodation, meals, healthcare, and vocational training. Expanding its model of tribal empowerment, KISS aims to educate 200,000 children through branches across 10 states and 30 districts of Odisha. Operational centres include KISS Delhi (in partnership with the Delhi Government), Mayurbhanj, and Balasore, with new branches coming up in Kolkata (with Help Us Help Them), Bolangir (Oswal-KISS), and Baripada (Adani-KISS). The Emami-KISS Residential School also follows this holistic, free-education model, providing equal opportunities and comprehensive care for marginalized communities.



* Kanya Kiran- Empowering Women

Launched with UN Women and the Kalinga Fellowship, the *Kanya Kiran* program reached every Panchayat in Odisha, raising awareness on violence against women and girls. Over 3,000 KIIT staff, mainly women, led village-level campaigns promoting gender equality, hygiene, and environmental awareness.

In the year of 2024, National Girl Child Day and the International Day of Education were celebrated by 'Kanya Kiran' across 52 places including 30 district headquarters of Odisha.



KIIT has evolved into a multidisciplinary institution offering education in Engineering, Medicine, Law, Management, Nursing, Biotechnology, Media, and Humanities. Guided by the ideals of the Radhakrishnan Commission, it promotes compassion, gender respect, and peace, while conducting various social development initiatives in education, employability, and related areas.

For instance, in the Kandhamal Parliamentary Constituency, KIIT facilitated employment for 7,000 rural youth and provided skill training to 15,000 more, partnering with 80 companies nationwide.







❖ KIIT Community Engagement Cell (CEC): KIIT's CEC began its work in Kandhamal, an aspirational district with 75% ST/SC population, and has significantly contributed to rural development. The University has adopted 10 villages to transform them into smart, model villages through education and infrastructure support. Kalarabank in Cuttack, now a certified smart village, features city-like amenities such as schools, healthcare, banking, and telemedicine facilities.





- ❖ Prayash Skill Training Programme: Under the Prayash initiative, KIIT trains 150 unemployed tribal youths from Kandhamal annually in solar PV installation. In partnership with OTDS and OSFDC, KIIT provides skill training to SC/ST candidates across several Odisha districts, including Kalahandi, Kandhamal, and Mayurbhanj. So far, over 1,100 candidates have been trained, with around 75% successfully placed in industries within and outside the state.
- ❖ SPIC MACAY KIIT Chapter (KSAC): Established in 2003, the SPIC MACAY–KIIT Chapter promotes Indian classical music, dance, folk art, yoga, and crafts among youth. It has hosted renowned artists like Pt. Hari Prasad Chaurasia and Ileana Citaristi through free, open concerts celebrating India's rich cultural heritage. In 2023-24, the chapter also organized multiple social outreach activities focused on education, skill development, and community growth.

- ❖ PARAMARSH' Scheme (UGC): KIIT, as a UGC-nominated mentor institute, supports 11 colleges and one university in achieving NAAC accreditation. It regularly conducts workshops and meetings to guide mentee institutions through the Self Study Report and accreditation process.

❖ Local Start-Up Financial Assistance

KIIT-TBI: Fostering Innovation for Livelihoods and Poverty Reduction. Established in 2009, KIIT-TBI is Odisha's first and largest university-based Technology Business Incubator, enabling innovation-driven entrepreneurship. In 2022, it provided incubation support to 223 startups, including 68 from Odisha—the highest since its inception. By nurturing early-stage businesses in biotechnology and other sectors, KIIT-TBI has generated employment, enhanced income opportunities, and supported the economic inclusion of aspiring entrepreneurs, contributing directly to poverty reduction in the state.

• Startup Odisha Yatra

Startup Odisha Yatra, an initiative of Startup Odisha, reached 30 districts and 100+ colleges in search of entrepreneurial talent that led to the development of the startup ecosystem at the institutional level. The Yatra sensitized the youth about the basics of innovation & entrepreneurship and how they can ace the opportunities available at Startup Odisha.

The day-long boot camps in each college includes presentations on Startup Odisha and State Startup policies followed by an extensive ideation workshop an idea pitching session was held to select the foremost ideas by the students for the Grand Finale. The van campaigning has enabled the students to pitch ideas and get selected for the acceleration programmes. Cash prizes. mentoring & incubation support and others shall be given to the Top 10 selected ideas.

The initiative aimed to build sustainable livelihoods by providing skills, scheme awareness, and platforms to harness Odisha's tribal resources for socio-economic growth.

KIIT has partnered with NBCC to provide skill development and industry-focused internships for KIIT and KISS students, especially those from SC/ST and economically disadvantaged backgrounds. The MoU also opens opportunities for exposure at NBCC project sites nationwide and explores setting up a research facility at KIIT. Additionally, NBCC will support the Kandhamal district in upgrading Community Health Centers, strengthening socio-economic development in the region.
